The National Fund for Christian Science Nursing (NFCSN)...

...is a benevolence fund to assist Christian Science nursing patients in the U.S. They can help in situations where a Christian Science nurse is needed, as well as to pay some costs associated with nursing including supplies, equipment, travel, and related Christian Science practitioner invoices. This is intended as an aid for those seeking healing through Christian Science. The NFCSN is administered by The Principle Foundation.

We asked Bruce Jeffrey, Executive Director of the Principle Foundation, "Why go to NFCSN for aid?" Here's his response:

"Seeking the help of a Christian Science nurse or a Christian Science practitioner is more of a matter of prayer than of paying. Let's call for help when we need it, and then expect to find healing. And let's include making the payment as part of the demonstration. Our Leader again teaches us, 'When we are willing to help and to be helped, divine

Have you ever considered a career as a Christian Science nurse? Have you had nudges towards it while helping someone? Do you find your present job not quite fulfilling and want to watch God work? If this idea of becoming a Christian Science nurse has stirred within you for a day or for many years, ask God what to do with this desire. Then rest assured—an answer full of great blessings will follow.

aving been supported by a Christian Science nurse during and after our child was born, I am more grateful than ever for Christian Science nursing. Although I'm a lifelong Christian Scientist, I can see better now how I had previously taken Christian Science nursing for granted. The unselfed care and spiritually-minded thought, "founded on the rock," that was provided by the Christian Science nurse had a distinct and profoundly healing effect. I felt that healing touch in even the most routine tasks—when she prepared a meal, made a bed or changed the baby's diaper. Knowing how these examples helped me, I have been inspired to commit to going about my own daily work in a more spiritually-minded and loving way.

I was also inspired to dig deeper into the By-law about Christian Science nursing and Christian Science nurses in *The Manual of the Mother Church* (p 49, Article VIII, Section 31). Perhaps I felt this way because I had never needed so much the care that Christian Science nursing provides. But from that study and my experiences I now understand better just how vital this work is to the cause of Christian Science, to Christian Scientists, to all mankind! All Christian Scientists can and should be endeavoring to express those important nursing qualities that nurses, including Noontide's nurses, express so faithfully and generously. I am deeply grateful for the work of Christian Science nursing, for Noontide, and for all Christian Science nurses.

The practical care my wife received during childbirth stood out to me as an expression of the Immanuel-presence of the Christ. The Christian Science nurse on the case was calm, professional, and humble. It is hard to overstate our gratitude for the care that Noontide provided for us. aid is near' (*Miscellany*, p 166:19–20). We have the right and the ability to demonstrate healing and gratitude, including payment, in every case. This is not theoretical, but practical; not just provable but proven.

"Besides making payment, we can show our gratitude in many ways, including seeking out how to help others or to ease their burdens. We often hear of progress being made when a patient seeks out ways to help others, such as always having a grateful heart for the work of the Christian Science nurse or practitioner."

An attendee's account of Noontide's second Christian Science nurse By-law workshop


here were two primary insights that solidified for me during the Christian Science nursing workshop with Tina Bilhorn of Tenacre Foundation, based on The Christian Science Nurse By-Law (*The Manual of the Mother Church*, Article VIII, Sec. 31).

The first came when we dug into the statement on page 395:17-20 from *Science and Health*, in an effort to understand what aids in healing: The qualities that help in bringing about healing are, "cheerful, orderly, punctual, patient, full of faith,—receptive to Truth and Love." Conversely, the qualities not conducive to healing are, "ill-tempered, complaining or deceitful."

The second came from exploring Bible characters who expressed nurturing qualities. For example: Ruth companioning and caring for her widowed mother-in-law, and Paul encouraging his fellow shipmates while a violent storm destroyed their ship, then how each made it to land and were provided for. I was able to see that every interaction with another is an opportunity to apply these comforting healing qualities and exclude the ones that are not conducive to healing.
